The third **LIMECONNECTION**, the biennial conference of the Leaders in Indigenous Medical Education (LIME), will be held in Melbourne on 3 and 4 December 2009, with a pre-conference **INDIGENOUS CAUCUS** at the Institute of Koorie Education in Geelong on 2 December. The conference is an outcome of the LIME Network, a Medical Deans Australia and New Zealand Project hosted by the *Onemda* VicHealth Koori Health Unit within the Melbourne School of Population Health at the University of Melbourne. The conference is being held under the auspices of Medical Deans, the Australian Indigenous Doctors' Association and Te Ohu Rata O Aotearoa Māori Medical Practitioners Association of Aotearoa. Keynote speakers include experts in medical education and Indigenous health from Australia and New Zealand.

This year's conference will focus on **Advancing Indigenous Health: Workforce Innovations**. Specifically, the conference will address leading approaches to integrating Indigenous health into medical education and workplace training. In addition, the conference will provide an opportunity to discuss and challenge some current practices and discuss emerging tools and techniques to drive continuous improvement in outcomes for Indigenous health.

LIMECONNECTION provides an opportunity for the professional development, networking, capacity-building and advocacy functions of the network to take place. The target audience includes Indigenous and non-Indigenous medical educators, Indigenous health specialists, general practitioners, policy makers, and community members from Australia, New Zealand and further afield. **LIMECONNECTION** seeks to encourage and support collaboration within and between medical schools and to build linkages with those from other health disciplines.

LIMECONNECTION also hosts the **LIMelight** Awards which acknowledge and celebrate the many successes in Indigenous medical education.
