To support participation of students and community members in LIMECONNECTION V, bursary places will be offered to Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander and Māori medical students and community members with a strong interest in Indigenous health. Indigenous medical students are also encouraged to submit an abstract to present at LIMECONNECTION V, as students who have submitted a successful abstract will be considered first for bursary funding.

Each bursary will cover the costs of registration, travel, accommodation and meals.
